When was it deposited? (1) in the date of construction? (2) in cover with strata II PNE after a destruction while reconstruction. (3) in cover with II which is only according to Netzer? (4) Later with no connection with probably known stratigraphy?

~~It's~~ its latest coin dates to 428-423 rather close to the end of Hellenistic fixed before as Ter. p. q. date for erection and this might give a better more accurately p. q. date ^{for the erection}. How much can we trust the 1931 survey coins to give us a date ⁽⁴¹⁴⁻⁴⁰¹⁾ for the deposit period? Where exactly did they come from?

Inside Hall Stratigraphy

From the top downward

Ia changes in the Hall including (1) new base for the ~~synagogue~~ Torah Shrine

(2) an Ionic capital put upside down between two columns in the western row. for additional support of ARCHITRAVES!

(3) Blocking the outside entrance to the room abutting the syn. on the east; laying a new plaster covering over walls and floor

I The erection of THE ASHKAR WALLS, Benches, colonnades, first Torah Shrine, Hard plaster floor

II 3 walls or remains of walls unearthed in our last season in April 1933 (unpublished)

in the western half of the syn. (in the northern half in all the pits no strata were found between hard I floor and rock bottom)

These are therefore pre-synagogue walls of a smaller building as yet unidentified (for wooden presyn. walls see exc. of Hammath Tiberias)
