Obv: Resembling cross, doubtful if this is a coin.

Obv: Bust of Emperor to left

Rev: Deleted

Coin unidentifiable. Probably Roman, 4th Century AD

Obv: Lion marching to left "The King"

Rev: In Hexagram

"There is no God but Allah."

Mameluke, ca. 14th century AD

53. 7/30/70. SE 1:24:C-6. 24005

Obv: Head of Emperor, right, veiled. DV CONSTANTINVS PT AVG

Rev: Emperor in Quadriga

In exergue: ALEX

Posthumous issue of Constantine I, ca. AD 337.
